## **Explanation of the Public Question**

Approval of this act would authorize \$400 million in funding for Green Acres, water supply and floodplain protection, and farmland and historic preservation projects through the sale of State general obligation bonds.

The Green Acres program acquires land that protects water supplies and preserves open space, including parks, fish and wildlife habitat, and flood prone or affected areas. It also funds park improvements and facilities.

Of the total sum authorized:

- (1) \$218 million will be used for Green Acres;
- (2) \$146 million will be used for farmland preservation purposes;
- (3) \$24 million will be used for the "Blue Acres" program by which the State may purchase from willing sellers, for open space preservation purposes, properties that are prone to or have incurred flood or storm damage;
- (4) \$12 million will be used for historic preservation purposes.

All spending of the authorized bond proceeds will be subject to full public disclosure.
